We hereby certify that, to the best of our knowledge and based on reasonable due diligence:

Conflict Minerals Policy

We do not knowingly source or use tin, tantalum, tungsten, or gold (3TG), collectively referred to as “conflict minerals,” that originate from conflict-affected or high-risk areas (CAHRAs), including but not limited to the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries, unless those materials are certified as conflict-free by a recognized third-party scheme (e.g., the Responsible Minerals Initiative - RMI).

Supplier Due Diligence

We require our suppliers to source materials responsibly and provide evidence of due diligence regarding the origin of conflict minerals. This includes:

Providing Conflict Minerals Reporting Templates (CMRTs)

Maintaining traceability of minerals back to smelters/refiners

Participating in third-party audit and verification programs where applicable

Product Scope

Our standard product range, including stainless steel and powder-coated electrical enclosures, cable management systems, and accessories, are designed and manufactured in accordance with RoHS, REACH, and conflict minerals compliance requirements. Based on supplier declarations, the components and materials used in the fabrication of our enclosures are “DRC Conflict-Free.”

Ongoing Commitment

We are committed to continual monitoring and improvement of our conflict minerals compliance practices, including engagement with suppliers and stakeholders to ensure ethical sourcing throughout our supply chain.
